


Why 'Sew Awareness'?

In 2019 I was privileged to meet Ruth Wright, a Marine Biologist running the Turtle Rehabilitation Centre at Bayworld Aquarium here in Port Elizabeth.

Through the early restrictions of the Covid-19 Pandemic, when our movements were restricted and the Aquarium was run by a skeleton staff of 3 instead of the usual 19, I was able to volunteer due to the nature of my other job allowing me to move around. It also gave me the chance to help using my sewing skills – there was a turtle who needed help with floatation due to a consolidated lung. I made him a little life jacket arrangement with movable floats that could be attached in various places.

On another occasion, I was able to sew custom padding panels into the sides of a crate for a turtle relocation flight to Durban. Using sewing skills like this made me think of other ways we as needle-crafters could help, and quilts as a medium for spreading awareness came to mind.

I learned firsthand how devastating the effects of ocean plastic pollution are on turtles. It led to a new level awareness of how environmentally damaging our casual consumerism is.

So, when considering a theme for our 2026 Quilting Festival, Environmental Awareness was the first idea to come to mind.

I am part of a lively group of friends who meet regularly. One day, the five us were chatting over coffee and cake and the need for a theme for our upcoming festival was raised. They were surprised we had never used the theme of environmental awareness before, considering how it has become so much more popular in our culture. A few weeks later the need for a theme now had a deadline and of course, like all quilters, a deadline brings a new level of focus and the idea of Sew Awareness popped into my head. I cannot take credit alone. This idea was born of discussions with like-minded women who all contribute to our society differently.

I am hoping that the title and theme have brought inspiration and fierce awareness to the quilting community, sparking ideas and small changes in consumer patterns, materials usage and attitudes to fabric waste and recycling.

Sew Awareness - A viewpoint

Recycling, Sewing Awareness, Upcycling, and Sustainable living, especially through the lens of fabric and textile reuse:

Stitching a Greener Future: Recycling, Upcycling, and Sewing for Sustainability

In an age of fast fashion and disposable culture, the environmental toll of textile waste has become impossible to ignore. Every year, millions of tons of fabric end up in landfills, contributing to pollution, greenhouse gas emissions, and resource depletion. But amid this crisis lies a powerful opportunity in that through recycling, upcycling, and **Sewing Awareness**, individuals can transform waste into worth and leave a lighter footprint on the planet.

Sewing Awareness: A Return to Craft and Care

Sewing is a skill that empowers people to mend, create, and personalize their belongings. In a world dominated by mass production and low-quality disposable consumer goods, sewing offers a counter-narrative of intentionality, creativity, and sustainability. By learning to sew, individuals can:

- **Repair damaged clothing**, therefore reducing the need to buy new.
- **Alter garments** to fit better or reflect personal style.
- **Create items from recycled materials**, such as tote bags from old jeans or quilts from fabric remnants.

Sewing Awareness also means understanding the environmental cost of textiles. **Cotton**, for example, requires vast amounts of water and pesticides to grow. **Synthetic** fabrics like polyester are derived from fossil fuels and shed microplastics into waterways. By choosing sustainable fabrics like organic cotton, hemp, bamboo, or recycled fibres, and using them mindfully, sewists can make a meaningful difference.

Upcycling: Creativity Meets Conservation

Upcycling is the art of transforming discarded materials into something of higher value. Unlike recycling, which often breaks materials down, upcycling preserves and elevates them. In the sewing world, upcycling can be magical: For example:

- **An old shirt could become a stylish apron.**
- **Old curtains and scraps can be reformed into beautiful quilts.**
- **Denim scraps can be stitched into patchwork jackets.**


Upcycling not only reduces waste but also celebrates individuality. Each upcycled piece tells a story, blending sustainability with self-expression. It is a way to rebel against fast fashion and embrace slow, thoughtful creation.

QUILT & WINE PAIRING

MONTPELLIER

de Tulbagh

The annual Stoep Tasting Wine Weekend in Graaff Reinet, hosted by the Karoo Wine Club, is one the premier wine tourism weekends in South Africa and it showcases top independent wine and spirit producers from South Africa and abroad. Nieu Bethesda has been incorporated in this event since 2022.

Montpellier de Tulbagh is involved in Nieu Bethesda and their wines can be tasted on the stoep of The Bethesda Guesthouse. The owners also have a restaurant where Riëtte Eggink, brand ambassador for Montpellier, hosts a "Bubbles and Brunch" event, which serves as a Methode Cup Classique Master class. As there is also a unique wine cellar on the premises, Antoinette Kriel approached Riëtte about the possibility of pairing wine with quilts, specifically art quilts, using the wine cellar as a special venue.

The concept is to bring together the art of wine making with the art of quilt making. Each year, six quilt artists in South Africa are invited to participate. Each receives a specific wine from Montpellier to use as inspiration to create their own unique textile art piece. During the Quilt & Wine Pairing event, the guests taste each wine, and while listening to the tasting notes, they are challenged to pair a textile piece to that wine.

This unique event has been hosted by Creative Journeys and Montpellier since 2023 and proves to be much fun and is met with great appreciation for the respective arts.

2025-2026 - 13TH SAQG TRAVELLING EXHIBITION OF QUILTS

The South African Quilters' Guild Travelling Exhibition aims to raise awareness for the art of quilt making by showcasing the work of its members. The Travelling Exhibition quilts travel the country for approx. one and a half years to guilds and groups, exhibition spaces and galleries to expose quilting to other artists and the general public.



All SAQG members were invited to participate in the SAQG Travelling Exhibition by making a quilt inspired by the theme '**Sew Conscious**'. We welcomed traditional-styled, modern and art quilts!

According to vocabulary.com **conscious** is a Latin word which originally meant "alert" or "aware". It is about knowing and perceiving; having an awareness of your surroundings, sensations and thoughts. Being conscious, according to seamwork.com, is about living with intention, which comes from having a specific viewpoint on the world. Intention links our view of the world and the way we engage within it – it connects our values and our actions.

The conditions were that the entry must be a quilt, consists of 3 layers and made primarily of cloth. Any techniques or construction method may have been used. The final Collection consists of 32 quilts, each measuring 40cm wide by 55cm long.

FIBREWORKS

Intertidal - An exhibition of textile art by members of the Fibreworks group

Explore the ambiguous zone between earth, sea and sky where only the indefinite is definite! Leave preconceived ideas at the door and let your imagination discover an altered awareness curated by a dozen Fibreworks artists specially for the festival. There are no rules, no boundaries here.

“What if?” is the question implicit in the way materials, techniques and viewers are pulled into a space where unexpected meanings emerge.

Every encounter with the work is intuitive, personal, and unique to time and place. Like the ebb and flow of changing light, textures, intentional transgressions and dynamic colour relations shift continuously.

This is art beyond the limitations of obedient artificial intelligence. The digital world offers no substitute for the awareness roused by textile art – potently physical, present in the moment, and pulsing with the sense that human hands have been at work.

No wonder art textiles are now centre-stage in many galleries and museums throughout the world. Engaging with the expressive potential of fibre is virtually a prerequisite for every emerging (and established) artist these days.

And South Africa's Fibreworks group pre-empted this exciting development by nearly three decades, holding regular national exhibitions that have consistently broken new ground in the art world. (www.fibreworksart.com)

SAY HELLO - At least one artist will be available most of the time for on-demand walkabouts of the INTERTIDAL exhibition. This could be your chance to pause and refresh your own creativity.



Accommodation

The hostel on the Collegiate Girls' High School premises, Waterfield House, offers accommodation for 108 delegates. This puts you under the same roof as the Quilt Exhibition, satellite exhibitions, classrooms, vendors and lecture venues.

One hundred and eight (108) single beds are available, of which 34 are single rooms, 17 are 4-bed shared and 2 are 3-bed shared rooms. Accommodation reservations must be made via the booking portal on our website, on a first-come-first-served basis. Please book early to avoid disappointment.



Jurors

Jurors are SAQG accredited Judges; their duty is inspect each entry and ensure that all quilts entered comply with the relevant Competition Rules (Section 1/Competition and Section 2/Display Only) and are of the acceptable standard for the SA National Competition as well as appropriate subject matter.



Trienie Krugel

Trienie started quilting in the late 1970's, creating mostly traditional quilts, although the urge to break the "rules" always lurked in the shadows and paved the way for the transition into more innovative and art work.

Trienie has no formal art training and is mostly self-taught. "I enjoy the process, the problem-solving challenges that each piece presents almost as much as the finished product," she relates.

"My inspiration is mostly found in nature, often inspired by Scripture, and I design my own quilts. Colour is probably my favourite design element; I love detail and add a lot of handwork to my pieces."

Many of her quilts have been awarded 1st or 2nd prizes. She has been awarded Master Quilter status by SAQG.

Trienie has served on the SAQG committee as well as the Vaal Triangle committee. She is a founding member of the Golden Rand Guild. She was a Tutor (Copyright) for the SAQG Teacher Training Course. Trienie has judged Quilt shows in South Africa and Zimbabwe and officiated as Juror at many shows.

She was included in the SAQG Quilters Hall of fame in 2021. Besides making quilts, Trienie loves the judging process and feels that it is a great responsibility and honour to be able to give positive feedback to entrants at quilt shows.



Antoinette Kriel

Antoinette is a passionate textile artist and textile enthusiast who lives in St Francis Bay, Eastern Cape. She started quilting in 1992 and since then her creative journey has taken her from the art of quiltmaking to discovering different stitching techniques and how to apply them to textile/fibre art pieces.

Antoinette's interests have led her to initiate and successfully curate quilt and fibre art exhibitions as well as SAQG Quilt Collections, namely the SAQG's 30th Birthday Collection, the Teachers' Forum Hands Up Collection and the 12th and 13th SAQG Travelling Exhibitions.

Antoinette is a Master Quilter and an SAQG Accredited Quilt Teacher and Quilt Judge. Since 2016 she has served in various capacities in quilt competitions and challenges, in SA and Zimbabwe, as a judging room organizer, a scribe, a juror and a judge.

She finds the task a humbling experience and is always mindful of the many hours artists and quilters spend creating their works. Dal Botha

At the time, she could barely sew on a button but a friend encouraged her to join quilting classes and it quickly became a true passion. Every step of the process, from measuring and cutting to stitching, was done entirely by hand!

Teachers have spent long hours preparing exciting workshops to teach and expect you to be geared up.
- Participants should refrain from wearing strong perfume as a courtesy to fellow participants sensitive or allergic to fragrance.

All levels:

Intermediate:

Quilters who are competent in the basics and are keen to attempt and master more intricate patterns and techniques. Quilters who can piece accurately, appliqué points and curves, hand quilt even stitches and select different colour schemes. These quilters may have attended regional or national festival level classes and even entered into shows. You are a proficient quilter.

Advanced:

Experienced quilters who have mastered a wide range of quilting skills, can work on complex designs or free-motion quilting, adapt patterns or design their own and 'fudge' problems – quilters who may have entered national or international shows. You are looking for new challenges or advanced techniques. The sky is your limit!
